- Professional Courses (15 hours): Complete the required credit hours for each category below and choose two additional courses from any category.

  - Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (3): Select 3 hours of the Diversity and Social Advocacy track of GLD
  - Business/Management (3 hours): ACCT 222, ACCT 225, ECON 224, MKTG 350, MGMT 371, ISCI 402
- ISCI recommends one of the following: SAEL 200, SPCH 145, or SPCH 230. SAEL 200 is approved to fulfill the CC-CMS and VSR requirements. If SPCH 140, 230 or 260 is used to fulfill the CC-CMS requirement, then a separate CC-VSR course will be required. SPCH 140 and 260 cannot be used to fulfill both the CC-CMS requirement and the ISCI public speaking requirement.
- Students in the School of Information Science are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 121 course through course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score.
- ISCI Electives (12 hours): No more than 6 hours may be selected from JOUR courses.
