USC School of Medicine Educational Trust: The 5500 filing on the retirement plan was submitted ahead of the deadline last month. All information for the form 990 tax filing has been submitted to the auditors. Updated certificates and letters on professional liability coverage for USC employed providers were distributed to the clinical departments and clinical partners last month. We will soon begin working with the medical group on 2025 member compensation agreements.

- i. Nationally renowned expert in addiction counseling Amanda Giordano was this Fall Speaker Series presenter on October 11
- ii. Two C&R students (Jerzy Zito and Skylar Linder) will be going to the SACES conference in Dallas to present at a Round Table with faculty (next week)

b. Genetic Counseling:

- i. Students and faculty volunteered at the Go Leo Halloween Run, and the proceeds support SMA.
- ii. We hosted a table at the Walk for Life, which was successful and saw a lot of foot traffic.

c. Nurse Anesthesia:

- i. Applications increased 20% over last year.
- ii. Florence expansion proposed.

d. Physician Assistant:

- i. The admission cycle has closed, and we have 30 students set to start in Jan. We had over 1000 applicants
- ii. Didactic students also participated in a health fair for the employees at Spirax Sarco (manufacturing plant in Blythewood)- students discussed different health topics with the employees, such as preventative screening tests, diabetes, hypertension, stress management, etc. It was part of their research class. Groups of 3-4 students researched topics and had to create a patient education pamphlet. Feedback from the company was overwhelmingly positive, and they want to have the students back in the spring.

<u>Faculty Senate Report – Dr. Fiona Hollis</u>

General Faculty Meeting Notes from September 4, 2024

Report from the President:

- Thankful for minimal damage from hurricane Helene on campus. Upstate and Aiken had it worse
 with damage to infrastructure and without power for at least 5-6 days and didn't recover until
 earlier this week (Oct 6). There was significant damage in UNC and sister institutions in Western
 NC. It will take longer to recover. Very proud of our students who took the initiative to collect food,
 clothes, and basic needs. These were delivered to counties in Western NC.
- Faculty hires: at the final stages, next 51 tenure-track faculties within 2 years, making a total of 100 new hires (49 already assigned). Note: these are net new positions.
- Vice President for Marketing hire: at the final stage
- 9 big projects (each > \$25 million): including the following:
 - New medical school: expected completion in summer 2027, \$330M
 - Brain health center (clinic): expected completion in summer 2026, \$35M
 - Science & technology building (classrooms and labs): completion summer 2025, \$30M
 - Thomas Cooper Library renovation: first changes starting in summer 2026, completion in summer 2028, funded by reserves
 - o Jones Physical Science Center (2-3 floor): completion in summer 2026, funded by reserves
 - MacBride will disappear in next 1-2 years one of oldest dorms in center of the campus.
 Will be rebuilt with significantly higher capacity of beds.

- Honors dorm was built missing a wing will be finished. Both paid by student tuition and increased number of beds will make a difference
- Significant renovation in Russell House increasing dining, relocation of bookstore;
 completion fall 2025
- Renovation of Barnwell and McKissick: Barnwell renovation of spaces/offices and importantly new classrooms added. McKissick building – enhancement of building façade to be more transparent and visible. Enhancement of side – accessible patio on top and coffee shop lounges for student and classrooms. McKissick museum to exhibit in areas of life.

Report from the Provost:

- Provost Arnett thanked faculty for teaching remotely during 2 days of intense storms and the week that followed.
- Biweekly check-ins ongoing. The Provost always ends each check-in with a shoutout to a unit doing something exceptional. Let her know if your unit deserves a shoutout.
- Donald Myles: US News Ranking #1 public university 1st year experience and international business, #4 nursing; Rose 3 spots to #61 for Public university hope to get to the top 50.
- Held Fall Retreat with 160 faculty and staff attending. Discussed prioritis and goal of 94% retainment of freshman/sophomore (to get us on par with UGA and UA). Presentation will be available on retreat website soon:

Mental Health Absence Pilot study

This is a pilot that will be rolled out on campus in the coming few weeks after midterms. The gist that was relayed to faculty senate was the following:

- The Office of Student Advocacy currently provides guidance and has forms for student excused absences in certain categories:
 - https://sc.edu/about/offices_and_divisions/student_affairs/our_initiatives/academic_success/ombuds_services/our_services/class_absences/index.php
 - Death of a friend, Death of immediate family member, Legal obligations, mandatory interviews for employment or professional school, medical care of immediate family member, medical condition or illness, military duty or obligation, participation in an authorized university activity where the student has a formal role and required visa or other immigration appointments.
 - This pilot would expand their role to include the collection of a form for students to request an excused absence for "wellbeing and/or mental health"

- Office of Student Advocacy will collect data on how, when, and why students are requesting
 excused absences due to mental health. Office will also provide resources to promote mental
 health to the student following submission of the request.
 - The goal is to empower students to be more proactive during their mental health absence. Examples that were given include: asking the student if they would like information on mental health resources; asking if they would like to talk to a counselor.
 - Other schools offer a limited number of excused absences for mental health/wellbeing to their students
 - UNC offers 5 wellbeing days UNC is being used as a potential model of what we at USC might want and not want to do
